

# Ways of Travelling to School


- 1. Walk, Scooter or cycle.

We car share to reduce our carbon footprint.






# SAFE TRAVEL TO SCHOOL FOR PARENTS

#### WALKING

When the time comes to teach your child about crossing the road, remember the following:

- always set a good example by choosing a safe place to cross and explaining what you're doing
- let your child help you decide where and when it's safe to cross
- tell your child that it's safest to cross at a pedestrian crossing or a crossing patrol
- tell your child not to cross where they can't see far along the road
- explain that they should not try to cross a road between parked cars; drivers won't be able to see them very well and the cars might start moving
- use the Green Cross Code with your child; explain that you have to stop at the kerb, then look both ways and listen for traffic before crossing
- when it's safe to cross, walk straight across the road and keep looking and listening out for traffic
- remind your children to concentrate they may be easily distracted, forget what they
  have been taught and dash out into the road
- make sure that anyone else looking after your child follows the same road safety rules that you do



# SAFE TRAVEL TO SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN

WALKING

















Wear Bright Clothing! Be Bright and Be Seen!



Riding in cars or school buses comes with some responsibility: You need to ride safely. Luckily, it's not hard to do. Keep reading and you'll learn the rules of car and bus safety



To be safe when they travel to and from school, follow these simple safety rules:

#### AT THE BUS STOP OR CAR PARK

- Always walk to the bus stop. Never run.
- Walk on the sidewalk. If there is no sidewalk, walk on the left facing traffic.
- Always go to the bus stop about five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- While at the bus stop, wait in a safe place away from the road. Do not run and play while waiting.
- Wait for the bus to stop. Cross only when all traffic has stopped. Look left, right, and left again before crossing.

#### ON THE BUS OR CAR

- Go directly to a seat. Put your seat belt on. Remain seated and facing forward for the entire ride.
- Talk quietly (so the driver will not be distracted).
- If you need to talk to the bus driver: wait for the bus to stop, raise your hand, and call the driver's name.
- Never throw things on the bus or out the windows. Never play with the emergency exits.
- Keep the aisles clear at all times.
- If there is an emergency, listen to the driver and follow instructions.

#### Exit the Bus or Car

- When getting off the bus make sure you walk (not run). Stay away from the bus wheels and watch out for moving cars!
- Once you get off the bus, go straight home so an adult will know where you are.
- Only get on and off the bus at your designated stop. If you need to get off the bus somewhere else, you will need to have a note from your parents.

• If you leave something on the bus, never return to the bus to get it. The driver may not see you come back and they may begin moving the bus. Also, if you drop something near the bus, tell the bus driver before you attempt to pick it up, so they will know where you are.
